# International Communication Division, AEJMC Minutes of Business Meeting Chicago, USA, August 10, 2017 8:30–10:15 PM

#### 1. WELCOME AND CALL TO ORDER

- 1.1 Outgoing Division Head, Ammina Kothari, Rochester Institute of Technology, calls meeting to order
- 1.2 Acknowledgements
- 1.3 Kothari introduces incoming Head, Mohammed Al-Azdee, University of Bridgeport, and all outgoing division leadership. Passes the Chair to Al-Azdee
  - 1.3.1 Incoming Division Head Mohammed Al-Azdee presents a plaque to Outgoing Division Head, Ammina Kothari, in recognition to her hard work and the example she set to follow.

## 2. ATTENDANCE

2.1 At 8:39, Division Head Al-Azdee calls for the approval of the minutes from past year's (2016) business meeting, located at ICD's website. The motion is moved, seconded and approved.

- 3.1 Acknowledgement of previous heads of division. Al-Azdee states that they are important part of membership and we rely on their wise judgement and support, and that junior members need their support to move forward. Upon request to stand up to be recognized, six of previous heads stood up at the meeting.

# 4. NEW AND CURRENT BUSINESS

- 4.1 Report on conference activities by outgoing Head, Ammina Kothari, talks about updates on the website, increased posts on social media, also twitter feed on website, and also more updates are available on the website. There are 228 paid members. For the Annual Research Competition, we had 81 reviewers, with 74 submitted papers (49 faculty, 25 student). Programming: for pre-conference programming, we had 1 workshop, 5 peer refereed research sessions, 2 invited research sessions, 1 invited teaching session and 3 invited PF&R sessions. Mentions the diversity and different topics presented. Events: Off-site tour visit that morning, India Tribune on Thursday August 10. Invites for the annual off-site dinner on Friday, August 11. Invites to the business meeting of AEJMC, all division heads have been given instructions to invite everyone to that meeting, held on Friday morning.
- 4.2 Report from the membership chair, Kevin Grieves, At 8:45. 228 paid members. Gain a few members over the past couple of years, goal is to maintain current levels. Main actions are getting former members, laxed members to re-engage with the division, trying to attract from

- outside of the US, encourage grad students. Encouraging mentoring program. Brief survey earlier in Spring, research liaisons connecting with resources and connections outside the US.
- 4.3 Report from the Teaching Standards Chair, Anna Popkova: Encourages everyone to upload and use the growing Syllabus Bank, which is an ongoing ICD effort. The Teaching panel on teaching media in the Middle East and negotiating gender. Third update is on the teaching contest, second year, very successful, thanked the reviewers who helped make it possible, and thanked the sponsors.
- 4.4 Building Global Connections: Focus on Refugee and Migrant Crisis for AEJMC 2018, Incoming Head, Mohammed Al-Azdee, Branding Chair Betty Tsakarestou. Betty explains the history of this initiative to engage European scholars and media professionals on this timely issue, thinking that the refugee crisis was a topic of wide interest. Proposals: A plenary session with two divisions interested in co-sponsoring it (newspaper and online news division and communication and technology division). Even if plenary session does not happen, committed to be part of programming next year. A panel-proposal, special call for papers. Plan on stronger focus in panels, also call for teaching sessions, please propose a session.
- 4.5 Research in Progress, James W. Markham Competition Chair, Jatin Srivasta, Incoming Head, Mohammed Al-Azdee (at 8:58). Jatin started initiative to engage and mentor graduate students: it's a research in progress section to focus on AEJMC's review process, with some of the students whose papers were rejected, to present, trying to give them the opportunity to receive greater feedback. We are bridging with graduate students interest group on this. It fulfills education mission, brings people to conference otherwise might not come, and loyalty from those entering academia. This proposal is being submitted to the President of AEJMC on Saturday. There would be a process in how this would work. At 9:00 pm, Ammina Kothari asks those in meeting if there is support from membership, and yes, there is support to the initiative and want to see it happen next year.
- 4.6 Best Poster Award: Incoming Head Al-Azdee says that, in an effort to improve scholar to scholar sessions, he's proposing a best poster award, one for faculty and one for students. This would encourage more submission and participation, as well as the presentations. Next year would be a pilot application, evaluate and consider if the award should continue. There will be certificates and money for winners. Membership supported the initiative and wanted to see it happen next year.
- 4.7 Reports from Regional Liaisons. Fatma Elsayed was grateful for the support for participation. She constructed a database of 50 different scholars and universities in North Africa and Arab Gulf countries from different disciplines, also included Egypt, Algeria, Morocco, Libya, Saudi Arabia, and United Arab Emirates, and plan for next year to include other countries also, and thinks these scholars are willing to participate in all activities, and her intention is to increase this list. Ammina Kothari said that we have a database for scholars and practitioners who are willing to help you, if you are doing research or want to distribute survey or need guest speaker. Sally Ann Cruikshank said for Sub-Saharan Africa, she also added several scholars from Ethiopia, Rwanda and several other countries, and really trying to reach out not just scholars but journalists and students as well. Also, recruiting other liaisons. Betty Tsakarestou said for Europe, working with Lea Hellmueller, they've done extensive work to promote ICD, and started adding some names, and most of them are on LinkedIn group, and asked people to join the group because this is where connections will take place. They called for ideas to get more scholars connected. Betty says Europeans want access to our resources, want to know what benefit to them would be, so this resource is important. Leo Ferreira said that they had about 30 contacts from Latin American Universities, with only a few country exceptions, encouraging

- participation. Al-Azdee makes the point about improving messages to be sent to social and digital chairs, make their life a bit easier when sharing.
- 4.8 Next conferences are in DC in 2018, Toronto in 2019, and San Francisco in 2020. For 2021, we have four options. Ammina Kothari says that every four years the conference goes to middle states, with four options here: Kansas, New Orleans, Austin and Saint Louis. At 9:17, motion proposed, seconded and passed (at 9:22) that, since three of these cities are involved in travel bans, so we will vote for New Orleans, provided that New Orleans will not be included in any ban.
