New Journal Affiliation and Award



Online Media and Global Communication, the English language quarterly journal founded in 2022 by former editor of Journalism and Mass Communication Quarterly, Louisa Ha, will begin sponsoring a new faculty paper and a student paper award for ICD annually starting 2024.

The total amount of the award is \$500: \$300 for faculty paper and \$200 for student paper. The journal is sponsored by Shanghai International Studies University School of Journalism and Communication Studies and published by Walter de Gruyter in Germany. The award aims to promote online media and global communication research especially cross-national comparison research and online media research with global communication implications. Preference will be given to paper collaboration between Global North and Global South scholars. There will be two awards. All papers submitted to ICD's Stevenson open paper competition are eligible for the OMGC Best Open Paper Award and all papers submitted to the ICD's Markham student paper competition are eligible for the OMGC Best Student Paper Award after committee selection. All research methodologies are welcome. OMGC has the first right of refusal to publish the paper in OMGC. Please note that only authors who agree to submit the paper for OMGC review and publication will receive the award.
