Featured Speakers:

Daniel Evans is the news director and content chief of the South Florida News Service. He also is an associate professor of journalism at Florida International University. Prior beginning work at FIU in February 2016, he worked at the Los Angeles Times as its community news editor. During his tenure, his publications received more than 80 local, state and national awards, including an EPPY from Editor and Publisher in 2012 for having the best news website in the country. He has also worked at the San Francisco Examiner, Hollywood Reporter and Los Angeles Daily Journal. He holds a bachelor's degree from the University of California, Berkeley and a master's degree from the Columbia University Graduate School of Journalism.

Frank LoMonte is the Executive Director of the Student Press Law Center and is actively involved in New Voices USA (www.newvoicesUSA.com) campaign to get student press rights legislation passed in every state. This growing national initiative has just obtained the support of the Society of Professional Journalists. According to an article on the SPLC Website by Roxann Elliott, "SPJ is throwing their weight behind the effort, issuing a resolution at their 2016 Excellence in Journalism convention in New Orleans declaring their unyielding support for concrete First Amendment protections for student journalists."

Benjamin Mullin is the managing editor of Poynter.org.
