For your final paper your group will carry out and analyze the results from one of your quantitative assignments (content analysis, survey, experiment). Your final research paper should be limited to 15-25 pages double-spaced not including references and appendixes. It should be formatted according to APA guidelines.

 - Why it is relevant to answering your RQ/Hyps. (validity)
 - How it has been used in the past
 - Note if changes were made to existing measure
 - Note if it is a measure you created specifically for this study
 - Response alternatives for measure
 - Representative items (include in appendix)
 - Variable calculation technique
 - Reliability of variables
 - Name of "new" variable(s)

 - Actual steps used to collect data from subjects
 - Walk reader through as though they were a participant
 - Recruiting
 - Assignment
 - Informed consent procedures
 - Instructions given to each group
 - Order of task(s)
