
- Organization of journalists for journalists









Egyptian authorities are holding at least 13 journalists in jail.




Of the 13 journalists in jail, three are affiliated with Al-Jazeera. More than 65 journalists have been detained since July 2013, according to CPJ research. Most have been freed. In 2012, no journalists were in prison in Egypt.

A third of journalists imprisoned around the world are freelancers.



60 percent of imprisoned journalists are held on anti-state charges, far more than jailed on any other type of charge.


The Digital Frontier

The Obama administration has conducted more than twice as many criminal prosecutions for alleged leaks of classified information than all the previous U.S. administrations combined.



