Lessons Learned in first round

- Need for flexibility and adaptability what is taught and how it is taught must change to keep up
- Storytelling is central purpose
- Coordination necessary across sections and from one semester to the next
- Best students seek to work in multiple media

Moving to Convergence 2.0

- Faculty wants more convergence, but who should deliver it?
- Students want more interactive/digital journalism but need writing, reporting with technology
- Industry seeking answers, help but also provides mixed messages re what it wants, needs

Moving to Convergence 2.0

- Faculty discussing single track and needs to determine:
 - 1) teaching skills basics to those who don't want to become highly proficient
 - 2) commitment to flexibility and adaptability
 - 3) commitment to own digital/technology skills coupled with journalistic foundational skills
 - 4) how to incorporate innovation/entrepreneurial thinking
 - 5) mindset of training students to be good journalists using various media, technologies for that purpose
