### **OVERVIEW**

This media practicum is to involve students in Morningside College Television (MCTV), the student television station that is available on Long Lines Cable Channel 9.1 (on campus).

# **OBJECTIVES**

During this practicum, students will:

- 1. Learn and be able to demonstrate a basic understanding of the operation of equipment required for "broadcasting" of MCTV programming on Cable Channel 9.1. This will include, but not be limited to the Nexus scheduler and the computer graphics system for making Community Calendar slides
- 2. Learn and be able to demonstrate a basic understanding of the setup and operation of TV studio equipment, including cameras, video switcher and audio, plus remote production gear such as the TriCaster and PegVault.
- 3. Assist with MCTV coverage of sporting events. Participation in at least FOUR such events is required during the semester. (For COMM 407 students, these will be required DIRECTING events). Everyone has busy schedules, so don't wait until the last month of school to try to get all your events in. FYI, regularly scheduled basketball games end in early February, so we don't have too much time. If a scheduled event doesn't work for you, you may suggest another event. You must get ALL of the required events completed during the semester to receive a passing grade in this class.
- 4. Brainstorm ideas for attracting additional students to work on MCTV projects.

# **Bi-weekly Reflection**

Students will submit a bi-weekly written "reflection" on the work done over the previous two weeks. This reflection will be submitted via Moodle, and will consist of at least 100 words in each two week summary. The first of these reflections will be due **Friday**, **January 24** and approximately every two weeks after that, per dates posted on Moodle. These reflections should be written in complete sentences, with correct spelling, grammar, etc. The reflections should include thoughts about work already done, work scheduled to be done and suggestions for work that could be done. Each reflection will be worth 20 points. Please don't just tell me what we did...I already know that. Instead, give me your thoughts about the work you've done or plan to do.

A final reflection will be due on the day of the Final Exam, submitted as a 2 page paper, summarizing the entire semester. This final reflection will be worth 100 points.

The final reflection for COMM 407 students will be a 3 page paper, worth 150 points.
